


Lloyd, Atherton weigh-in on two-tier Test cricket

The agenda reportedly includes plans to increase the frequency of Test matches among the Big Three, ensuring that these teams face each other twice every three years, as opposed to the current cycle of once every four years. This proposed scheduling shift would inevitably reduce the number of matches played against other nations such as Pakistan, South Africa, Sri Lanka, and the West Indies, further marginalising teams outside the Big Three.

Clive Lloyd, the captain of the West Indies team that won the first two Cricket World Cups, has strongly criticized the proposed two-tier structure for Test cricket, which would allow India, Australia, and England to compete against each other more frequently while limiting opportunities for other nations. While acknowledging India's emergence as the financial powerhouse of the sport, Lloyd emphasized the significant contributions made by the West Indies to the development of cricket,

particularly through the participation of its players in England's County cricket system during the 1970s. "We were the cash cows for a lot of countries over the years... people must recognise that," he remarked. "But we are now in a situation where we need support, and we are unable to receive it."

Conversely, former Australian captain Ian Chappell has advocated in favor of a two-tier Test system. The 81-year-old, now a cricket analyst, contends that only a limited number of teams possess the capability to remain competitive in the five-day format over the long term. "There should have been a two-tier Test system in place years ago," Chappell asserted.

Former England captain Michael Atherton has also weighed in on the debate, emphasizing that any proposed system should ensure mobility between tiers and prevent the creation of an entrenched elite. He argues that the structure should not permanently sideline lower-ranked teams but rather offer them a pathway to compete at the highest level.

If the two-tier system is implemented, Australia, England, and India would no longer be obligated to play Test matches against several other nations. Instead, the three teams would face each other twice every three years, as opposed to the current arrangement of once



every four years.

Former South African captain Graeme Smith believes that Test cricket will likely remain viable for only six or seven nations. "If you can keep six or seven nations strong, people will always watch. When a strong team tours South Africa, we see good crowds and significant interest in Test cricket. World cricket needs South Africa to remain strong, needs the West Indies to regain their footing, and needs Sri Lanka to improve," Smith stated.

For a significant period, India faced unfair treatment from the International Cricket Council (ICC). However, under the stewardship of Jay Shah, the current ICC Chairman, there is a renewed commitment to promoting cricket on a global scale. Shah is making a concerted effort to secure cricket's inclusion as an Olympic sport, with plans already in motion for the game's participation in the upcoming Los Angeles Olympics.

The inclusion of cricket in the Olympics will primarily benefit associate member nations, as

it will grant them access to financial support from their respective government funding that is typically reserved for Olympic sports. This financial boost will play a pivotal role in enhancing cricket infrastructure and development in these countries. Consequently, discussions surrounding a two-tier Test system may become obsolete in the evolving landscape of international cricket.

Jay Shah has consistently demonstrated his dedication to sport through transformative initiatives. Within the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), he played a key role in launching the Women's Premier League (WPL), which has successfully completed two seasons. He also championed the cause of pay parity, ensuring that male and female cricketers in India receive equal remuneration. His contributions have earned praise from cricketing legends such as Sunil Gavaskar, who has acknowledged Shah's efforts in strengthening the governance and promotion of Indian cricket.
